
1/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 cup margarine 1 large egg yolk

or mix to blend. Cut margarine into chunks; add to flour mixture. Whirl or rub in with your fingers until fine crumbs form. Add egg yolk and vanilla. Whirl or mix with a fork until blended. Place mixture in a 9inch pie pan and press evenly over bottom and up sides to edge of rim. Flute edge. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 15-20 minutes or until crust is slightly darker around edges. Cool on a wire rack for at least one hour before filling. Can be frozen for later use.






