


Sub-state action

Lang, a freshman, lost in the first round to Smoky Valley's Talbot, a state qualifier from the previous year. Lang lost in the first round 6-3, 6-1, won the second round 9-7 and lost the third

In the final round, Lang face Ulysses' Bansemer. Lang was 2-1 on the season against her and, in the early going, looked to win again, but a late year. comeback ended Lang's hopes with a Amos and Palser won their first set
