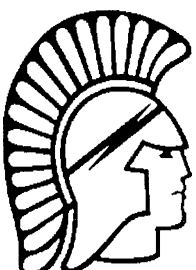


Ladies prepare for region

Jayhawks' wide receiver hoping for second redshirt

LAWRENCE (AP) — This was supposed to be Harrison Hill's big year. Due to graduate in December with a degree in psychology, the Jayhawks' senior co-captain began the football season with a shot at breaking Kansas' career receptions record. One hit changed all that. Returning a kick in the first quarter of the Kansas-UCLA game Sept. 8, Hill was slammed to the turf in front of the Jayhawk bench — and broke his shoulder blade in four places. He's been sidelined since then, facing the prospect that he could leave Kansas as the third all-time receptions leader with 108, well short of the record of 133. But one letter could change his fate just as quickly as that one hit did. A medical redshirt as a freshman because of a broken ankle, Hill wrote

to the NCAA on Friday requesting a sixth year as a medical redshirt. If his appeal is accepted, Hill could enter graduate school and resume his place as a starting wide receiver at Kansas next year. For Hill's sake, coach Terry Allen hopes for a speedy decision. "If they make a quick call on it, then it would be easier for him one way or the other," Allen said.

A swift decision would be the only thing that could make Hill feel better about this season. Standing on the side lines watching Kansas limp its way to its current 2-6 record has hurt Hill more than the therapy he's had to en-



All-Star teams to meet in Goodland

GOODLAND — The best volleyball players in the area will meet in the Sixth Annual Northwest Kansas All-Star Volleyball Match at Max Jones Fieldhouse in Goodland, 3 p.m. MST Saturday. Golden Plains coach Sheri Jacobs has been selected to coach hte Whiteshirt team. Kandy Schertz, from Triplains has also been selected to the team. The Blackshirt team will include Ashley Stevenson and Erin Rogers from Golden Plains, along with Brewster's Tara Fulwider. The match will be played under college rules, with the winner being the team that wins three of five games. All five games will be played, no matter the result. College rules have changed to 30 points and rally scoring. Net serves that go over the net do count. A selection committee chose 24 volleyball seniors from Northwest Kansas to play based on their consistently high level of play, statistics and previous honors. This year's players are from Goodland, Brewster, Cheylin, St. Francis, Sharon Springs, Weskan, Atwood, Grinnell, Hoxie, Oakley, Quinter, Scott City, Triplains and Wheatland. Three teams represented in this year's match, Scott City, Decatur County (Oberlin) and Grinnell qualified for their respective tournaments. Participants will receive an all-star shirt and a medal, which will be presented to them by their high school coach during a prematch medal ceremony. The Most Inspirational Player, as voted on by the players, will receive a plaque after the five-game match. The match is jointly sponsored by KLOE/KKCI Radio and Nor'West Newspapers.
