Kountry Kitchen

This recipe originated in Pie Town, N.M. population 75, located 85 miles southwest of Albuquerque.

Pie-O-Neer Coconut Cream Meringue Pie Pastry for a 9-inch single crust pie, unbaked Filling:

1 cup sweetened flaked dried coconut

1 cup sugar 1/4 cup cornstarch 2 and 1/4 cups whole milk 3 large eggs, (separate yolks and whites into two bowls) 1 teaspoon vanilla Meringue:

1/3 cup sugar 1 and 1/2 teaspoons cornstarch Egg whites 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar 1/8 teaspoon salt

With fork, prick bottom and sides of unbaked pastry in pan at about 1inch intervals. Bake in a 375 degree oven until golden, (about 15 minutes.) Let cool on wire rack. (Turn oven temperature down to 325.) Scatter coconut over bottom of pastry. In large saucepan, mix 1 cup sugar, 1/ 4 cup cornstarch, milk and egg yolks until well blended. Stir over medium-high heat for about 15 minutes or until mixture thickens. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla. Pour over coconut in crust. In a small bowl, mix 1/3 cup sugar and 1 and 1/2 teaspoons cornstarch, set aside. In a deep bowl, with mixer on high speed, beat egg whites, cream of tartar and salt until very foamy. Add sugar-cornstarch mixture, 1 tablespoon at a time, and continue to beat until meringue holds stiff, glossy peaks. Spoon meringue onto hot pie filling, spreading evenly to rim of pie shell. Bake in 325 degree oven for 15 minutes or until meringue is lightly browned. Let pie cool on rack for about 3 hours. Makes 8 servings. Cover and refrigerate leftovers.




