She was preceded in death by her husband Wilbur Garrett in 1952, and her second husband, Winston MacPhail in 1985.

She was born Dec. 23, 1922, at Levant, the fourth child of Roy and Martha Keck. She graduated from Levant High School in 1940, and in 1942 she married Wilbur Garrett. He served in the army for four-and-a-half years, being discharged in 1945. The couple lived in Levant until 1948 when they moved to Colby. Mr. Garrett died in 1952.

She worked as Methodist Church secretary, register of deeds, and for the Social Security Administration.

In 1973 she married Winston MacPhail and moved to Kansas City where they lived until his death in 1985. She then lived in Colby and Rexford, moving to Fairview Estates in 2001.

Mrs. MacPhail was active in the Methodist Church. She enjoyed dancing, reading, bridge and attending sporting events.

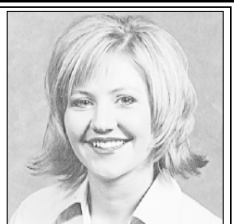
