Creamy Mashed Potatoes

2 tablespoons minced garlic 2 tablespoons olive oil 3 pounds potatoes, peeled and cut into 1-inch chunks Correspondent

1/2 cup sour cream 1/4 cup mayonnaise 1/4 cup heavy cream

1/3 cup chopped onion

2 tablespoons margarine Salt and pepper to taste

Heat olive oil in large pan over med-high heat. Stir in onion and garlic; sauté about 5 minutes. Scrap into small bowl. Fill the same pan, (no need to wash) with 4 cups water, and bring to boil over high heat. Add potatoes to boiling water, cover and return to a boil; reduce heat and simmer until potatoes are soft, (about 10 minutes.) Drain potatoes and return to pan. Add onion-garlic mixture, sour cream, mayonnaise, cream and margarine. Mash with electric mixer until mixture is smooth. Add salt and pepper. Makes approximately 8 servings.
