Evelyn Faye (Myer) Creach-Friesen died March 20, 2002, at the Sarah Ann Hester Memorial Home in Benkelman, Neb. Funeral services were Monday at the Haigler United Methodist Church, with burial at the Haigler Cemetery.

Survivors include three sisters, Velma Neville, Opal Collicott, and Grace Adams, and one brother, Gerald Myer, all of Haigler, Neb.; two stepsons, Herbert Friesen of Denver, and Leslie Glen Friesen and wife of Fresno, Calif.

She was preceded in death by her parents; two husbands; brothers, Everett Ross and James Wendell; and sister, Loretta Maxine.

Mrs. Creach-Friesen was born Dec. 23, 1907, on a ranch north of Callaway, Custer County, Neb., the first of eight children of James Laird Myer and Bertha Lureen (Martin) Myer.

Her childhood days were spent on a

farm south of Franklin, Neb. She began school at Red Cloud, Neb. She attended rural schools south of Franklin, and graduated from Franklin High School in 1926.

She taught in a rural school north of Franklin, Neb., in the Haigler Public Schools, in Pine Bluffs, Wyo., in Annapolis, Md., and for over 20 years in the Bird City Public Schools.

Mrs. Creach-Friesen graduated with magna cum laude honors from Chadron (Neb.) State College in 1957 with a bachelor of science in education.

She married Oscar Eulan Creach of Kansas City, Mo., on May 22, 1943, in McCook, Neb. Mr. Creach was in the United States Navy during World War II. At the close of the war, Mr. and Mrs. Creach returned to Kansas City from Annapolis, Md. They invested in a dairy farm, "Oselyn Acres" at Humansville, Mo.

In 1954, they moved to Bird City. The couple celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary in Bird City in 1968. Oscar died Sept. 11, 1969, following heart surgery in Denver, Colo. He was 69.

Mrs. Creach-Friesen continued teaching in the Bird City Public Schools until her retirement in 1973, when she became the editor of the *Bird City Times*.

After 12 and 1/2 years, she retired to marry Abraham T. Friesen of Colby on Jan. 12, 1985. She sold her home in Bird City and moved to Mr. Friesen's farm south of Colby where they lived for several years before moving into a home in Colby. Mr. Friesen died March 20, 1997, at Citizens Medical Center in Colby.

Mrs. Creach-Friesen was an active member of her community, and a member of various clubs. She entered Lantern Park Nursing Home in Colby after hip surgery in Hays. On Dec. 3, 1990, she entered the Sarah Ann Hester Memorial Home in Benkelman, Neb., to be closer to her relatives. She was a resident at this home for the past 11 years. She was a member of the United Methodist Church.

Memorials may be given in her name to either the Sarah Ann Hester Memorial Home in Benkelman or the Haigler United Methodist Church.
