Scout Ranch trek planned for 2003

soring a contingent to Philmont Scout youth applied to fill the contingent. Ranch near Cimmaron, N.M. in 2003. They will arrive at Philmont on Tuesday, July 22, and leave Philmont on Sunday, Aug. 3.

The contingent will consist of two crews of 12 members — 24 total participants. Each crew will have three to four leaders (at least 21 years of age). All leaders and youth participants must be registered in a Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Team or Venture Crew.

The minimum youth age is 14 years of age on Jan. 1, 2003 (or completed the 8th grade and be at least 13 years of age by July 21, 2003) and the maximum youth age is not yet 21 years of age by July 21, 2003.

Philmont Scout Ranch is large, comprising 137,493 acres or about 215 square miles of rugged mountain wilderness in the Sangre de Cristo (Blood of Christ) range of the Rockies.

The elevation ranges from 6,500 to 12,441 feet. Philmont has many hiking trails with specific programs to choose from.

In February of 2003 each of our crews will select trails (programs). If this trek is successful, the Coronado Area Council will probably elect to send future treks, as councils are given the opportunity to send a trek each year. Leaders chosen to be contingent leaders will be asked to serve on the contingent trek committee, which will begin to meet monthly or once every two months.

The estimated cost is approximately \$750 for this 14-day experience. The initial registration fee is \$50 and is refundable if not selected or if you cancel and a replacement is found. The total cost will mainly depend on the transportation method and if the trip will take more time than only to Philmont and back.

A drawing will be held on April 16 to select the youth participants. A maximum of two youth per Scout unit will
