

Brewster Prairie Gem sponsors rabies clinic

Late in the afternoon on April 23, 28 dogs and seven cats arrived at the Brewster City Building with their owners. The animals received vaccinations from Dr. Gary L. Smith of the Prairieland Animal Clinic in Goodland. Many of the pets received a rabies shot and some also got other needed injections.

The rabies clinic is a community service project of the Brewster Prairie Gem 4-H Club. Quentin Bear served as chairman of the committee which made arrangements for this event. He was assisted in organizing for the day by club leaders Dorothy Bear and Lisa Carney.

Junior leaders who helped at the clinic were Katherine Mills, Scott Carney, Quentin Bear, Avery Schultz, Dan Dewey, and Timothy Knox. Their responsibilities included filling out the vaccination forms, attaching rabies shot tags to animal collars, and collecting the fees for shots given.

City Clerk Judy Reid also attended the clinic. Her presence allowed Brewster city residents to purchase a required dog license and be given a city tag for their canine.

Club reporter Tim Knox discussed the history of this service project with rural Brewster residents, Lyman and JoAnne Goetsch. These former community leaders for the Brewster Prairie Gem 4-H Club said this club-sponsored community service has taken place for at least 25 years and probably longer.
