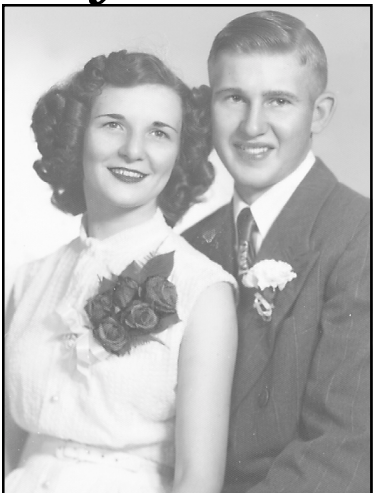

Bean and Cheese Enchiladas

- 1 (15 oz.) can refried beans
- 1 teaspoon chile powder
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cumin
- 2 and 1/2 cups shredded pepper-jack cheese
- 2 (10 oz.) cans enchilada sauce
- 8 (6-inch) flour tortillas

Heat oven to 375 degrees. In large mixing bowl combine beans, spices and 1 and 1/2 cups shredded cheese. Stir 1 can sauce into bean mixture. Spread 3 tablespoons of remaining sauce in bottom of 9 x 13 x 2-inch baking dish. Brush one side of tortilla with sauce, spoon 1/4 cup bean mixture in center, roll up and place seam side down in dish. Repeat with remaining tortillas and bean mixture. Pour remaining sauce over top, spreading gently to cover. Top with remaining cheese. Bake at 375 degrees 15-20 minutes, or until bubbly. Top each serving with sour cream and chopped green onions. Serves 4.
