Cox, Fulwider head for leadership class

Amber Fulwider of Brewster and Joshua Cox of Colby, area high school sophomores, will be attending the Kansas North Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership (HOBY) Seminar on Friday.

The three-day leadership seminar is held at Kansas State University in Manhattan with the Kansas North seminar hosting more than 170 young leaders from as many high schools throughout northern Kansas, officials said.

"Every high school in the United States may select one sophomore to attend a local leadership seminar," said Beth Riekeman, leadership co-chairperson.

"Kansas North HOBY is the local seminar serving the 195 schools in the 913- and 785- area codes," she said.

The Kansas North HOBY Seminar is a volunteer organization committed to the promotion of leadership in high school sophomores.

The seminar has been recognizes as an "Outstanding Seminar Site" five of the past six years, making it one of the top HOBY seminars in the country.

HOBY was founded by notable actor Hugh O'Brian, Riekeman said. O'Brian is primarily known for the television show Wyatt Earp.

During a trip to Africa for missionary work, O'Brian met Dr. Albert

Schweitzer. It was at this time that O'Brian became inspired to form a camp to positively impact today's youth.

"One of the things Schweitzer said to me was the most important thing in education was to teach young people to think for themselves," O'Brian was later quoting as saying. "From that inspiration, and with the support of others who believe in youth and the American dream, I started HOBY to seek out, recognize, and develop outstanding leadership potential among our nation's youth."

HOBY completed the dream of Hugh O'Brian by bringing together a select group of high school sopho-

mores. While at HOBY, these sophomores interact, not only among themselves, but also with distinguished leaders in business, government, education, and the professional work force to discuss issues pertaining to the world today and the future.

"Through these positive interactions, those attending gain not only confidence in themselves, but also begin to understand their leadership potential," Riekeman said.

"Promoting personal development, HOBY Ambassadors are then challenged to perform at least 100 hours of community service in their own community in the year following the seminar," she said.
