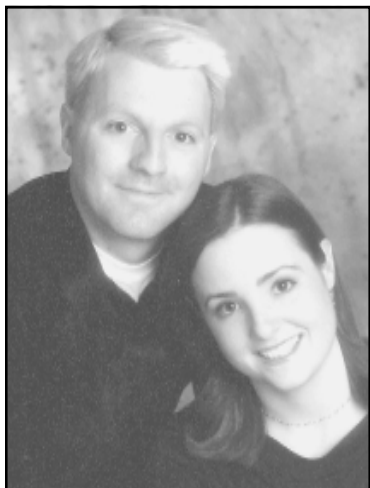
says they shared lots of memories and laughs, as well as a few tears. Since returning home, they have been informed that Jim has been placed in Hospice care.
