### Chiefs tackle gets 17 stitches and two weeks off after fight

AP Sports Writer RIVER FALLS, Wis. (AP) — Tackle John Tait, whose teammate slammed him in the face with a helmet, is the latest casualty in a Kansas City camp that seems beset by new problems almost daily.

Tait, the starting right tackle, will miss two weeks after receiving about 17 stitches over his eyebrow ridge and the bridge of his nose following a bloody fracas with rookie defensive lineman Eddie Freeman.

Coach Dick Vermeil had originally thought Freeman hit Tait with his fist. "He had my helmet and hit me with it. It wasn't his fist," Tait said Wednesday, waving photographers away from

his badly swollen face. "It's common knowledge he had my helmet in his hand and he swung it back and hit me with it. I have a broken nose."

Vermeil said Wednesday he didn't know what caused the injuries.

"I still don't know if there was a helmet to the face," Vermeil said. "I'm not going to get involved in that."

Asked about disciplinary action, Vermeil said no, cursed and stomped awav.

Freeman, a second-round draft pick out of Alabama-Birmingham, has been involved in several scuffles since the Chiefs opened practice on Friday.

Wednesday morning, about 14 hours after the fight, Freeman seemed out of sorts and was not playing well. Later, when talking with reporters, the 310pound tackle was subdued.

"I'm the young new guy on the block. It was just in the heat of battle," Freeman said. "I'm going to talk to him today."

Asked if he regretted the incident, Freeman said, "Oh, very much so. You don't want to get in no scrapes and look bad upon your teammates. I've got to work with those guys. I've got to eat

### with those guys."

He would not say what he planned to say to Tait.

"We'll keep it among ourselves," Freeman said.

Vermeil said he had not talked with Freeman, whom he called "a hothead." "But I talked with the team about it,"

Vermeil said. "Fights happen in football. You never know who threw the first punch.'

Vermeil has said he did not plan any disciplinary action against Freeman, but Tait wasn't sure he agreed.

"He apologized to me yesterday. But it was right after it happened and I couldn't talk to him at the time," Tait said.

"It's not like I want to kill Eddie. But I definitely think perhaps some disciplinary action should be taken. Maybe even for myself.

'Hey, fights happen. People's adrenaline is going. I don't know if you ought to hit people with their helmet.

"I don't think Eddie's a bad person down deep inside. Everybody makes mistakes. This one happens to be maybe a little bit costly.

Losing Tait for two weeks is a blow to the Chiefs, who are already missing All-Pro tight end Tony Gonzalez and No. 1 draft pick Ryan Sims in bitter contract disputes.

Gonzalez, a three-time Pro Bowler, is staying out of camp demanding more money.

But the impasse escalated sharply on Sunday when Chiefs president Carl Peterson withdrew an \$8 million signing bonus offer and said he would not consider a long-term contract until Gonzalez gives up his dream of a dual NBA/NFL career.

Sims, the sixth player drafted last year, had already been handed a starting job at defensive tackle, which was a weakness in the Chiefs' 6-10 season in 2001

He, too, is demanding more money.
