

If you are one of the 20 million people alive today who are old enough to find themselves on the 1930 census, or if you simply want to trace your familv lineage, the best place to start is the 1930 Census Web site, which is located at:

http://1930census.archives.gov which does not have a grocery store. Dave and is sponsored by the National Archives. It provides you with an index of the census schedule locations and will help you find the microfilm you need to buyer. 




