**Were you listed on the 1930 census?**

searchers have swarmed into regional branches of the National Archives to get the 70-year-old news of the 1930 census, newly opened to public view in April 2002.

If you are one of the 20 million people alive today who are old enough to find themselves on the 1930 census, or if you simply want to trace your family lineage, the best place to start is the 1930 Census Web site, which is located at: <http://1930census.archives.gov> which is sponsored by the National Archives.

It provides you with an index of the census schedule locations and will help you find the microfilm you need to view the actual records at a National Archives branch.

The census information is free to those doing their own research, and many large libraries now have all or part of the 1930 census on microfilm, giving people who remember the Depression era an opportunity to rediscover themselves.


