The following publication out of the ABC's of Rotary Handbook, outlines one of the wisest and most quoted statements of the world today.

The Rotary four-way test was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932, when he was asked to take charge of a Chicago based Club Aluminum Company which was about to face bankruptcy.

Mr. Taylor looked for a way to save a struggling company due to financial difficulty. He drew up a 24 word code of ethics for workers to follow in their business and personal lives.

The four-way test became a guide for sales, production, advertisements, all relations with dealers and customers. The survival of the company was due to this simple philosophy. Mr. Taylor became a Rotary International President in 1954.

His four-way test was adopted in 1943. Since then the four way test has been translated into 100 different languages and published in 1,000's of ways.

The message should be known and followed by all Rotarians. The fourway test is: 1. Is it the truth? 2. Is it fair to all concerned? 3. Will it build goodwill and better friendships? 4. Will it benefit all concerned?
