

## Brewster Bulldogs win back and forth battle with Sharon Springs

Down 14 points at halftime Friday night against Sharon Springs, they came back to win 38-34 in a back-andforth slugfest on their home turf.

The Bulldogs started out sluggish. The Wildcats were running all over their defense in the first half, and at one point the 'Dawgs were down 16-0. Brewster only had 18 total yards in the first half.

Brewster finally took the lead in the third quarter, but lost it on a kick-off return touchdown on the next play. Both teams played tough until the last second, but it was the Bulldog players who would go home victorious.

The Bulldogs' quarterback, Jacob Falcon, was sacked in the end zone at the start of the second quarter for a safety, and the Wildcats led 8-0.

At 9:26 left in the half, Sharon Springs scored again, this time getting the two-point conversion and leading

Brewster couldn't get anywhere on their next drive and punted out of bounds at the Wildcats' 36. After a time-out, the Brewster defense stepped


Coach Lesley Wagoner said "The Lady Eagles played extremely well

#### Hall of Fame center Webster dies at age 50

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Mike Webster, the Hall of Fame center who helped the Pittsburgh Steelers win four Super Bowls and whose life spiraled into drug use and homelessness after he retired, died at age 50.

Webster died in the coronary care unit at Allegheny General Hospital, but the hospital did not announce a cause of death. He was considered one of the game's greatest centers and was voted in 2000 to the All-Time NFL Team.
