Hattie E. Sanders, 98, died at her home in Colby on Aug. 29, 2002. Services were held in the Colby and Baldwin City United Methodist churches. Her grandchildren and great-grandchildren provided vocal and violin music.

Mrs. Sanders is survived by her son, John; two grandchildren; and two great-granddaughters. She was preceded in death by her parents, brothers, sisters, and husband.

She was born Aug. 19, 1904, to Edward Lincoln and Frankie Payne Hutchins in Red Cloud, Neb.

She attended "common" schools in Kanorado, Colby, Sharon Springs, Jamestown, a country school in Saline County, Kansas Wesleyan Academy, Kipp High School, and graduated from Arkansas City High School.

In 1927, Mrs. Sanders graduated with a Bachelor of Music degree in piano performance from Baker University in Baldwin City. In later years, she pursued a graduate program at Kansas State University.

Mrs. Sanders began her teaching career at Methodist Mission School in Savannah, Ga., where she taught instrumental and vocal music and English. She then taught at various Kansas schools for 39 years.

She and her husband, Rev. Howard M. Sanders, were the first couple to be married in the new Baldwin City Methodist Church on July 7, 1935. Over a period of 30 years, they served in Kansas churches. In addition to his ministry, he sang while she accompanied him on the piano.

Mrs. Sanders retired in Baldwin City in 1965. After her husband's death, she moved to her home in Colby to be near her son.

She was a member of the National Association of Music Education, Delta Kappa Gamma, the American Association of University Women, and Eastern Star, from which she received a 75 year membership pin.

Memorial gifts have been established in her name to the music departments of Colby United Methodist Church and Baker University.
