5th grade Eagles 12, Norton 24

The Colby 5th grade football team dropped its record to 0-3 on the season with a 24-12 loss Sunday to the Norton Blue Jays. Preston Krzycki, who is leading the league in rushing, added 100 yards in the game and one touchdown. Adam Weber scored Colby's other touchdown and was credited with 15 yards. Jordan Voss had 7 yards rushing and Kalen Rasmussen returned a kick for 12 yards.

Kalen Rasmussen and Ethan Stickel lead the defense with 5 tackles each. Stickel also recovered a fumble. Brandon Gordon recorded 4 tackles and two sacks. Brandon Rasmussen, Torey Taylor, Jarrett Marker, Bob Schroeder, Dylan Stithem, and Zach Barlow were

all credited with 2 tackles each. Adam Weber, Kirt Dugger, Brandon Standage, Garrett Rogers and Gray Henry had 1 tackle each.

Coach Chris Erickson said, “Norton had a big running back that gained 7 or 8 yards every time he carried the ball. At half time we told the kids to hit him low and wrap up his legs and in the second half we shut him down”. Coach Erickson continued, “I thought we played a very good game and I was pleased with our performance”.

6th grade Eagles 12, McCook 38

The 6th grade team traveled to McCook and came away with a 12-38 loss. Scott McCoy scored both of the young Eagle's touchdowns, one from 30 yards out and the other one on the last play of the game from 7 yards. McCoy finished the game with 107

yards rushing, 7 yards receiving, and 45 yards on a kick off return. Cade Carter ran for 28 yards, completed one pass for 7, and had 15 yards on a kick off return. Tanner Kriss was credited with 15 yards rushing and 63 yards on kick off returns. Treat Bugbee punted the ball twice for a 25-yard average. Cory Sager continues to lead the way on defense with 7 tackles, one sack, and one fumble recovery. Alex McEvoyn and Carter both recorded 3 tackles apiece. Sintra Brown, Matt Ryan, Brent Amburger, Jordan Hockersmith, Tyson Miller, and Tanner Kriss were all credited with 2 tackles each. McCoy and Bugbee both had a tackle each.

The young Eagles host the teams from Ellis this Sunday at Dennen Field. The 5th grade game starts at 1:30 with the 6th grade game to follow.

Colby was lead in the match by 6'2 freshman Ashley Blickenstaff. Blickenstaff had 9 kills, three service aces and four blocks in the conference match. Sophomore Talayna Akrie

added 5 kills while also leading the team with 21 assists. Amy Nichols contributed 5 kills while Heidi Koster added 2 service aces.

The Lady Trojans are now 14-9 overall and 1-3 in Jayhawk West action. Colby's next action comes this weekend with a shutout in Torrington, Wyoming. They will return home for non-conference matches against Lamar and Mid-Plains Tuesday, Oct. 1, at 4 p.m. at the Colby Community building.
