"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such there is no law." Galatians 5:23-24.

Two dear mothers whom I knew recently died within a week of each other. I am saddened by both of their deaths. One was a beloved mother of the church. She brought such joy into so many lives. Her laughter and kindness will not be forgotten. She had lived a long full life. The second was my daughter's best friend since middle school is mother. She was the mother of seven daughters; the youngest has Down's Syndrome. She too was kind and caring, and how patient she would have had to be to raise

seven girls. She died too young. Both were strong faith-filled women who lived their lives out of their love for God and God's love for them. They both exemplified the words that Paul wrote to the Galatian Christians. It was almost as if Paul already knew them and used them as his models when he described the fruit of

the Spirit. "See these two," he seemed to say. "Try to be like them." Paul said there is no law against these virtues, but sometimes it certainly seems that way. Animosity, even hatred, seem much more wide spread than love right now. It's easier to grumble and complain rather than be joyful. Kindness, goodness, and gentleness are praised as ideals, but are scoffed at as being weak or soft in real life. Peace is sought in our prayers, but we seem so willing to wage wars of every size. As for patience and self-control, all we have to do is get in a long line or not get our way and see how patient and self-controlled we really are.

There is too much that divides us and causes us pain - from the hidden most corners of our souls to the global hostilities that threaten us all. That's why I grieve the passing of theses two wonderful women. We need more mothers and fathers of the Spirit, not less. We need more people who know the steadfast love of God and use their lives to share that with others. We need more gentleness and kindness, peace and self-control. We need more love. Now is the time to make these words of Paul real in our lives and in world. After all, there's no law against it.
