ries, Jarrett Carpenter had one five yard carry, Jake Long carried once for two yards and Branson Gilley had minus three yards on two carries.

Defensively, Moore had 13 tackles, Swanson had 12, Falcon had eight Long had 10, Carpenter had nine, a fumble recovery and a sack, Jesse Crumrine had nine tackles, and Aaron Smith had six.

Tyler Johnson and Josh Ryan had two each and Cory Grantz and Selby had one each.

The Bulldogs face another tough opponent Friday night when they face the Golden Plains Bulldogs in a cross-county rivalry. Game time in Brewster is 7:30 p.m.

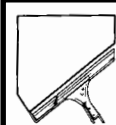
