PARSONS — The bad news was that Colby only brought home five medals from the 26th Annual Camron Bradshaw Takedown Tournament, which was held in Parsons, Kansas on Saturday. The good news was that all five were gold! The event is a nonsanctioned meet that focuses singularly upon takedown skills. Individual match points are tallied via a scoring system that is similar to freestyle wrestling and team scores are not kept.

Leading the way for the Trojans were Erkin Tadzhimetov (sophomore, Tashkent, Uzbekistan), Muzaffer Abdurakhmanov (freshman, Tashkent, Uzbekistan), Alibek Pardakulov (sophomore, Djizak, Uzbekistan), C.B. Dollaway (freshman, Mt. Gilead, Ohio) and Rio Mayo (freshman, Colorado Springs, Colo.).

Tadzhimetov earned the title in the 136-pound weight class with an impressive win over Neosho County Community College's assistant coach, Bogdan Ciufulescu. Ciufulescu was a two-time NJCAA national champion and also placed 4th at the 1996 Olympic Games. 
