Colby sweeps Ambassador Classic

Colby Free Press The Colby College Trojan men and women swept the S&T Communications Ambassador Classic over the weekend, defeating strong competition from Casper, Wyo., Western Nebraska, and Colorado Northwestern for the ladies, and Casper, Wyo., and Marshalltown, Iowa for the men. The Lady Trojans move to 5-4 on the season after their three victories, and the men improve to 6-0 for the second straight season.

Colorado clinches Big 12 North title; plays for conference title on Dec. 7

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) — Colorado accomplished what seemed so unlikely two months ago.

The Buffaloes clinched the Big 12 North title with a 41-27 win over Iowa State on Saturday night, advancing to the conference championship game for the second straight season.

The Buffaloes (8-3, 6-1 Big 12) got big performances in the fourth quarter from running back Bobby Purify and safety Medford Moorer, helping to compensate for the losses of Chris Brown and Donald Strickland.

Brown, the nation's leading rusher, departed in the third quarter with a bruised sternum after running for 127 yards and a touchdown. He was hospitalized overnight - but only so he would rest more comfortably than at home.

Strickland, Colorado's best defensive back, went down with a sprained ankle in the third period and also didn't
