Within two years Haas had bought his first retreading facility and became a district representative for O.K. Rubber Welders in Nebraska and northern Kansas.

He continued to grow the business through the years by aligning himself with Tire & Battery Corporation, wholesaling and retailing private brand tires and batteries in a multi-state area before selling the business to his children and retiring in 1978.

In 1997, he was awarded the Humanitarian Award by Tire Business Magazine, and inducted in 2000, into the Tire Industry Hall of Fame, by the Tire Industry Association.


