KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Veteran wide receiver Eddie Kennison signed a six-year deal with the Kansas City Chiefs on Monday. The team did not disclose terms of the contract.

### Injuries a factor this season, Big 12 coaches say during weekly conference call

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Muhleisen, the Cornhuskers' assist leader and second-leading scorer, is

X-rays Monday morning rehip socket, coach Barry Collier said Monday during the Big 12 coaches' weekly conference call.

The injury would not require surgery but will sideline Muhleisen for two to three months, Collier said. "I think he'll be able to come back from it," Collier said.

Muhleisen, a 6-foot-4-inch, 195pound sophomore, was injured when he fell hard after being fouled early in the Cornhuskers' 92-59 loss to Kansas on Saturday.

He was going in for a layup when he collided with Kansas' Nick Collison and landed on his back. He had to be helped from the court and did not play again. "He just landed in a kind of

torqued position. It was nothing deliberate by Kansas," Collier said. Muhleisen had started all 14 games for Nebraska (8-6) and was averaging 11.7 points and 3.4 as-

"He's devastated," Collier said. "He wants to help our team any way he can. We're really going to miss Jake, because he's our leader on the court and in the locker room."

Junior Nate Johnson, a junior college transfer, and senior Brennon Clemmons will share duties at point guard, Collier said.

Kansas also continues to deal with the loss of a starter to injury but Jeff Graves has done well as a replacement for forward Wayne Simien, Jayhawks coach Roy Williams said Monday.

In his last three games, Graves has averaged 11.3 rebounds and 9.3

"Jeff has done a nice job for us on Nebraska point guard Jake the backboards," Williams said. "That's been the biggest positive.

"Now he has to concentrate more out for the season with a broken hip. on the offensive end so he can be where he's supposed to be when vealed the fracture in Muhleisen's he's supposed to be there," Williams added. "He's given us some insurance, and if he can keep out of foul trouble he can be even more effective."

Simien, who has a separated right shoulder, has already missed two starts and will miss Kansas' games Wednesday against Wyoming and Saturday against Kansas State. He has started some light rehab work, Williams said, and will be re-evaluated early next week.

Losing a starter to injury can open things up for other starters as well as for backups, Texas coach Rick Barnes said.

Last year, when guard Chris Owens went down with a knee injury early in the season, freshman point guard T.J. Ford and center James Thomas picked up the slack as the Longhorns reached the semifinals of the NCAA Midwest Regional.

"I went to James and said, 'Why did you wait until Chris Owens gets hurt to step up?' and he said,'Coach, I didn't think it was my turn yet," Barnes said. "It's somebody's turn up there (at Nebraska) to step up, and I'm sure Barry will do a good job of making that happen."

The loss of Muhleisen overshadowed what's shaping up to be a milestone week for two of the conference's coaches — even though each played down his accomplishment.




