In their game with the Buffaloes, Colby was 57 percent from the line making 8 out of 14 free throws. Atwood was shooting 75 percent from the charity stripe and sank 9 out of 12 shots.

Four Eagles ended the night in the double digits. Chris Finley led the way with 14 points and was followed by Bruce Arnberger with 13, Jared Dinkel with 12 and Brian Sulzman with 10. Jordan Cranston put up 6 points, Sean Mengel and Jeremy Dietz both were credited with 4 points and Jordan Sharp and Derek Elliott each tallied 1. The only 3-pointer made by the Eagles was by Arnberger.

On Monday, the Eagles posted a 60-51 win over the Oakley Plainsmen. The free-throws became a critical element in the game as the Eagles went to the line 30 times. They were able to sink 20 of them for 67 percent. Oakley only visited the line 10 times, but sank 7 of them for 70 percent.
