Mr. Phillips was a 1928 Colby grad

Donald D. Phillips, widely known and respected Colby resident who died Sunday at age 91 at Lantern Park Manor, graduated from Colby High School in 1928. When he was a senior, he earned scholastic honors from the Colby Lions Club.

Mr. Phillips attended Fort Hays State University, the University of Kansas, and received his Bachelor of Law and Juris Doctor degrees in 1935 from George Washington University, Washington, D.C. At K.U., he was a member of Delta Upsilon fraternity and played basketball at Colby, Hays and K.U..

Mr. Phillips was on the Kansas Advisory Council on Inter-governmental Affairs from 1971-1975, appointed in 1959 to the board of directors of the Kansas Centennial Commission, received a certificate of honor from the Thomas County Historical Society, and received an honorary Associate of Arts degree from Colby Community College in 1987.

He served as honorary marshal for the Thomas County Fair, and was a Rotarian, Shriner and Mason, as well as a member of the Colby Tree Commission.

Mr. Phillips was made an *Honorary Citizen of Colorado Springs*, Colo. in 1966 and as a non-resident member of the Denver Country Club he played golf there as well as at the Broadmoor Hotel in Colorado Springs.

Private services will be held at Beulah Cemetery on Wednesday, and a memorial service will be held at 2 p.m., also on Wednesday, at Harrison Chapel.

Memorial contributions may be sent to Colby Community College, the Prairie Museum of Art and History or any Colby bank.

The Best Revenge has some evil force ready to exact revenge and the reader keeps asking, "But who is it?"

White's plot is sometimes maddening, but in the end exhilarating.
