

Annual Kansas state park permits are now available at the lowest allows entrance to all Kansas state crease from \$110.50 to \$150.50 on prices of the season.

Through March 31, annual state park motor vehicle permits are discounted to \$30, compared to \$45 beginning April 1. A permit for a second vehicle registered to the same owner is \$20 compared to \$25 beginning April 1.

The annual motor vehicle permit parks for the entire calendar year for the vehicle to which it is affixed.

Permits for Kansas residents 65 and older or holders of a Kansas handicap license plate or permanent placard are \$15.25 and \$10.25 for a second vehicle. In April, they will go up to \$22.75 and \$12.75 respectively. p.m. Monday through Friday.

Annual camping permits will in-April 1. These permits allow the permit holder to camp throughout the year without additional charges with the exception of utility fees.
