


Northwest Kansas All-Stars

Summar Stephens, Samantha Wolf, Desiree Sharp and Breann Hart all wrapped up outstanding careers for the Colby High School Lady Eagles Basketball team.

In three of the last four seasons the Lady Eagles have made it to the Breann Hart missed more than half class 4A State Basketball Tournament in Salina, finishing with the third place trophy in 2000. They have won back to back Orange and Black championships and currently the Eagles have two consecutive undefeated League championships under their belts.
