

# Eagles compete well in Norton

The Colby High School boys and girls track teams traveled to Norton on Friday to compete in the Norton Invitation Track Meet. Both teams were very successful as the girls finished first in the team scores and the boys finished fourth.

As well, the team brought home nine first place finished, nine second place medals and three thirds. Seventeen individual medals were also won for various fourth, fifth and sixth place finishes.

As a team, the Colby girls racked up 151 points, well above the second place finish of Norton with 94 points. Smith Center took third with 86 points, while Scott City had 75, Phillipsburg 53, Logan 38, Goodland 28, and Northern Valley 22.

For the boys, Scott City claimed first with 156 points, while Norton took second with 115 and Smith Center was third with 75. The Eagles finished fourth with a total of 66 points followed by Logan 59, Goodland 39, Phillipsburg 23 and Northern Valley 18.

In the 100-meters, Brent McCoy came in second with a time of 11.34 and Rocky Baalman was sixth with a time of 11.86. Nic Tubbs ran but did not place in this event. For the girls, Andrea Barker was third with her time of 13.20 and Shea McKee was second with a time of 14.03. Maret Peterson did not place in this event.

In the 200-meters, the two Eagles who competed on the boys team placed. McCoy took second with his time of 23.53, while Tubbs was

fifth with a time of 24.34. For the Lady Eagles, Barker placed second with a time of 28.18 and Peterson was fourth with a time of 29.15. Lori Ziegelmeier also ran the 200-meters, but did not place.

In the 400-meters, Erica Erickson placed first with a time of 1:04.12, while Jared Dinkel and Josh Cersovsky did not place. On the girls side, Ivy Ramsey was first in 2:30.9. Emily Sloan was fourth with a time of 2:42.3, while Amanda Seeman came in fifth with a time of 2:46.0

In the 800 meters, Shane Stover was first with a time of 2:09.7, while Jared Dinkel and Josh Cersovsky did not place. On the girls side, Ivy Ramsey was first in 2:30.9. Emily Sloan was fourth with a time of 2:42.3, while Amanda Seeman came in fifth with a time of 2:46.0

In the 1600-meters, Landon Stover, Baalman and Daniel Rogers all ran for the Colby boys. Stover was the only one to place. With his time of 5:24.4, he claimed sixth. For the girls, all three participants placed. Jessica Stephens finished first in 5:36.4, while Ramsey was second in 6:01.5. Zanae Baird was fifth with her time of 6:12.4.

In the two mile race, 3200-meters, David Barnum finished sixth with a time of 12:43.5. Rogers also ran the race, but did not place. Two Lady Eagles competed in this event and both placed. J. Stephens won first with a time of 12:09.7, while Baird was third with a time of 13:44.3

For field events, the Eagles did well in the event and placed at least one person in all of the events but

shot-put. In high jump, L. Stover and Clarissa Unger competed for Colby. Stover did not place, but Unger tied for fourth with a height of 4'4".

In the long jump, McCoy was first with a distance of 19'5", while Tubbs didn't place. Erica Molstad was first for the ladies with a distance of 15'11" and Jacquie Fry came in second with a distance of 12'11".

In the Javelin, none of the boys, Jason Schwindt, Zach Baird and Theo Kleinsorge, placed in the event. For the girls, Desiree Sharpe was second with a distance of 109'5" and Raya Mazanec was sixth with a distance of 86'7". Charell Rous did not place.

In the discus, Mazanec took fourth with a distance of 87'3", while Baird, Schwindt, Kleinsorge, Marcia Kaus and Rous did not place.

In the triple jump, Tubbs placed fifth for the boys with a distance of 37'4", while Peterson was fourth and Fry was sixth for the girls with distances of 28'3.5" and 27'11.25", respectively.

No boys competed in the pole vault, but Kaus was fifth for the girls with a height of 6'5". McKee did

not clear.

Kleinsorge, Schwindt, Mazanec, Sharpe and Kaus all competed in the shot-put, but did not place.

The girls 4X800 relay finished first with a time of 10:44.99. The team is made up of Erickson, Sloan, Seeman and Summar Stephens. The boys 4X800, made up of L. Stover, Cersovsky, Dinkel and S. Stover, finished second with a time of 9:01.81.

The girls 4X100 relay was third with a time of 55.0. The team is made up of Ziegelmeier, Barker, McKee and Peterson. The boys 4X100, made up of Baalman, Raymo, Simmering and McCoy, finished second with a time of 45.75.

The Lady Eagles 4X400 relay, made up of Erickson, S. Stephens, Ramsey and Kaiser, took first with a time of 4:20.92. The boys relay in the same event took second with a time of 3:43.75. The team is made up of Baalman, L. Stover, Raymo and S. Stover.

The Eagles will again be in action next Friday as they travel to Holcolm for an invitational meet that begins at 3 p.m. The 9/10 track team will compete on Tuesday at WaKeeney at 4 p.m.

## Sports Briefs

LAWRENCE (AP) — Kansas reserve forward Bryant Nash will have surgery on his right wrist, trainer Mark Cairns said Wednesday.

Nash, a junior who played in all 38 games this past season, tore cartilage in his wrist during the NCAA tournament. He will have surgery Monday afternoon in Lawrence and his rehabilitation is expected to last about three months.

Nash averaged 2.9 points and two rebounds in 12 minutes a game.

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — All-American guard T.J. Ford of Texas was injured during a pickup basketball game and was released from a hospital after four hours of treatment.

Team spokesman Scott McConnell would not elaborate on the injury, cit-

ing federal privacy laws.

He said Ford was conscious when he arrived and may have collided with another player. There were no coaches or trainers on the scene when he was injured at a campus gym.

A witness said Ford was playing with Texas basketball and football players and fell after he was slapped on the back of his neck, the Austin American-Statesman reported Wednesday in its online edition.

Texas coach Rick Barnes was smiling and joking after visiting Ford at the hospital but declined to comment on what happened.

The sophomore guard was taken by ambulance to the Hospital and was treated. Ford's parents, who live in Houston, were notified.
