## Colby track excells in Goodland, Atwood meets

The Colby High School track team was busy last week as they participated in meets at Goodland on Monday and Atwood on Tues-

Individually, the team turned out stellar performances from both the boys and girls teams.

In Goodland there were no team scores taken as it was specifically a meet for freshmen and sophomores. There were 8 first place, 5 second place and 3 fourth place medals brought home as well as one each for fourth, fifth and sixth place finishes.

For the girls, Zanae Baird finished first in both the 800-meter and 1600-meter races, with times of 2:50.8 and 6:28.3 respectively. Adriana Buchanan finished fourth in the 1600-meter with a time of

Jacquie Fry took third in the long jump with a distance of 13'2.5" and fourth in the triple jump with 27'3". She also brought home hardware with her fourth place finish in the 200-meter, with a time of 31.2. Janessa Rasmussen was third in the high jump with a height of 4'0" and also competed in the discus but did not place.

Morgan Stephen was first in the 200-meter with a time of 29.2 and second in the 100-meter with a time

In the relays, the 4X100 team of Buchanan, Fry, Rasmussen and Stephen finished first, while Baird, Buchanan, Rasmussen and Stephens were second in the

standouts. David Barnum finished third in both of his races. He completed the 1600-meter in 5:48.8 and the 3200-meter in 12:57.

Matt Grove took first in the pole vault with a height of 10'. He also competed in the 100 and 100-meter races, but did not place.

Jared Simmering was fifth in the 400-meter with a time of 59.5 and sixth in the 200-meter with a time of 25.7. Simmering did not place in the 100-meter.

Also competing in Goodland for Colby were Daniel Rogers and Brian Seeman. Rogers and Seeman both ran the 800 and 1600-meter The following day in Atwood.

Colby girls finished first out of six teams with 152 points, while the boys came in second behind Dundy

Team points for the girls were: Colby 152, Dundy County 150, Decatur County 124, Atwood 106, Bethune Colorado 2 and Herndon 0. Team points for the boys were: Dundy County 188, Colby 122, Decatur County 107, Bethune 63, Atwood 52 and Herndon 7.

The girls brought home a whopping 18 first place medals, while the boys had 7.




