K.C. Royals can't overpower Red Sox

AP Sports Writer BOSTON (AP) — Boston's bullpen is improving just when Kansas City's is struggling.

Red Sox relievers pitched 8 1-3 innings and their hitters overcame a two-run deficit to beat the Royals 6-5 Thursday night.

"There is not enough that can be said about those relievers," Boston manager Grady Little said. "These guys were outstanding."

His relievers faltered during the first two weeks of the season, while Kansas City's were solid. Mike MacDougal had 10 saves in the Royals' 17 wins but is 0-2 in the four-game slide that followed.

Boston swept the series — coming from behind in all three games - with relievers who allowed five earned runs on 10 hits in 13 1-3 innings with no wild pitches or hit batters.

Kansas City's relievers worked 8 1-3 innings, giving up 10 earned runs on 18 hits with three wild pitches and six hit batters. The last run Thursday scored in the eighth on Todd Walker's winning double off Jason Grimsley (1-2), who pitched in all three games.

Were the relievers getting tired? "It seemed like it," Royals manager Tony Pena said. "They've had to work a lot lately.

Boston's Steve Woodard was shocked at the work he got when he came in after starter Casey Fossum was ejected with two outs in the first for throwing a pitch behind Raul Ibanez after Mike Sweeney's tworun homer. Little also was ejected, and Fossum denied deliberately throwing behind Ibanez one day after Kansas City pitchers hit three Red Sox batters in the ninth.

"I really don't think you prepare for that," Woodard said of his entrance. "When it catches you off guard, it's probably the best thing that can happen."

Without time to get nervous, he allowed two singles in 41-3 innings before tiring in the sixth when he gave up a two-run homer to Carlos Beltran and a solo shot to Ibanez, making it 5-3.

But Kansas City didn't score again as Mike Timlin pitched 1 2-3 innings and Jason Shiell (1-0) and Brandon Lyon (second save) pitched one each in Boston's fourth straight win.

"The key part of the game was the

job Woody did," catcher Jason 3-2 in the third. Varitek said.

Kansas City starter Kyle Snyder did well in his debut in the major leagues, allowing one earned run in five innings, but left trailing 3-2.



PHOENIX (AP) — Four-time NLCy Young Award winner Randy Johnson underwent successful arthroscopic knee surgery, his first operation in seven years.

Johnson had tests on his right knee about two weeks ago, and the decision to operate was made after a second test showed loose particles causing inflammation in the lefthander's knee.

Johnson, 24-5 last season, won his first game in three decisions Sunday after spending two weeks on the disabled list.

Doctors removed the particles in a brief operation and drained fluid from the knee. Johnson, who will be on crutches for a few days before beginning rehabilitation, is expected to miss three-to-six weeks.

AMES, Iowa (AP)—Iowa State associate head basketball coach Steve Barnes was suspended for making what the university said were threatening remarks against the administration and athletic director Bruce Van De Velde.

Barnes' suspension came one day after Van De Velde suspended Eustachy and recommended that he be fired because of newspaper reports that the coach had partied with college students after two road games.

GREENSBORO, N.C. (AP) — Jerry Eaves, an assistant with the Cleveland Cavaliers, was hired as the men's basketball coach at North Carolina A&T.

Eaves, a guard on Louisville's 1980 national championship team, replaces Curtis Hunter, a former North Carolina player who compiled a 28-70 record in four seasons.

Eaves was also an assistant in the NBA with New Jersey (1994-96) and Charlotte (1999-2001).

STATESVILLE, N.C. (AP) — Casey Atwood is rejoining car hit all 14 fairways.

OWINGS MILLS, Md. (AP) -Former Chicago wide receiver Marcus Robinson has agreed to terms with the Baltimore Ravens.

Robinson, released by the Bears two weeks ago, is entering his seventh year in the NFL and has 187 career receptions for 2,695 yards and 20 touchdowns in 28 starts.

Robinson had 21 catches last season after missing all but five games in 2001 with a knee injury.

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (AP)-Annika Sorenstam played her best on the longest holes at the Michelob Light Open, shooting a 3-under-par 68 to trail the leaders by two strokes.

Tour novice Giulia Sergas posted a career low 66 to share the lead with rookie Lorena Ochoa and Denise Killeen. Grace Park and Hee-Won Han shot 67. Akiko Fukushima, Karen Stupples and Suzann Pettersen also shot 68 to finish tied for sixth.

Sorenstam, the tour leader in driving distance, capitalized on the course's three par-5 holes, posting an eagle and two birdies. She also
