Brady Dible, has signed a letter of intent to play

basketball for Kansas Wesleyan University, Salina. Dible, a 6'0'

guard, averaged 12 points a game this season and earned Honorable Mention All-State and

All-Western Kansas Liberty League honors. He was also selected to play in the Heart of America All-Star game in Salina.

Dible missed his entire junior season following a catastrophic knee injury during football. This season, as he was able to gain more confidence coming back from the surgery, his improving floor play and scoring from the point guard position sparked Golden Plains to ten consecutive victories, including defeating Tribune by 10 points in the sub-state finals. Tribune had been to the state tournament the previous year, while Golden Plains had not been since 1993.

"Even though we had four seniors, we really had no high expectations for ourselves, especially after starting out 1-5. But we just kept Dible of Menlo.

Recent Golden Plains graduate, getting better and playing together better all season long," Dible said.

" I worked hard to come back from my knee injury and our successful season was worth all the effort. The toughest part of the season was losing in the first round to Hanston," he said. "They were a good team — so were we."

Dible was also excited to have the opportunity to play with players from rival schools such as Lance Hartman of Wheatland and Devan Weiser of Grinnell, who have also


