He and Gordan Giricek were dealt to Orlando in mid-February for Mike Miller, Ryan Humphrey and two future draft picks. He averaged 13.6 points and 8.4 boards in 19 games for the Magic.

Gooden said he had spoken with Roy Williams a couple of times since his college coach left Kansas for North Carolina in April.
