Legion loses two at state; ends season 20-9

Colby American Legion was one of eight teams in the Kansas State AA Tournament this past week in Pratt. Colby played two hard fought games but unfortunately came away with two losses.

Game one lined up Colby with a

tough Baxter Springs club. Scott Wolf struck out four in five and two-thirds innings of work, but was not able to earn his sixth victory of the summer. Chris Gordon and Matt Augustine combined to finish the game and held Baxter Springs to no runs.

Colby's afternoon at the plate was

less than enjoyable as righty Darrell Dinger of Baxter Springs struck out 12 to earn the victory. Jeff Williams led Colby at the plate going 2 for 3 with an RBI. William's RBI came in a three run fourth for Colby, which started when a Josh Houtz sacrifice bunt was thrown over the first baseman's head. Brian Sulzman, who reached base by taking a pitch in the elbow, scored all the way from first. Houtz eventually scored on a Bruce Arnberger single. After walks to Chris Gordon and John Wark, Williams finished the scoring with a ground ball that brought home Gordon.

That inning tied the score 3-3, but Colby could not hold Baxter Springs as they scored two in the fifth and one in the sixth.

Colby again challenged in the seventh when singles by Sulzman and Houtz loaded the bases for

Jared Cranston, who walked to bring home Scott Wolf. Wolf had reached base on a dropped third strike. Baxter Springs eventually got out of the inning and earned the 6-4 win.

Jared Cranston struck out six Sabetha hitters in five innings of work in game two, but Colby could not put up the run support needed for the victory.

Colby held a 2-0 lead in the bottom of the fourth when Sabetha mounted a comeback and took a 3-2 lead. Colby could not figure out Matt Strathman of Sabetha, who only struck out three, but did not walk a single Colby hitter.

Josh Houtz and Bruce Arnberger both had two hits in the final game of the season.

Colby finishes the summer 20-9 with a team batting average of .330 and a team ERA of just 2.45.
