Sheets snags winner

From a Colby Eagle to a Chadron Eagle, Beau Sheets' name is common talk in western Nebraska. Sheets, a former Colby High football standout, caught the game-winning pass last Saturday afternoon as the Chadron (Neb.) State Eagles squeaked past Western State College, 23-22, at Gunnison, Colo. The pass was a 15-yarder thrown by quarterback Shawn Eisenreich with just 1:27 left to play. Sheets caught the ball in the corner of the end zone. The Eagles had completed a 54-yard pass to Bryce Flammang of Cambridge (Neb.) two plays earlier to set up the win-

ning touchdown. Chadron State coach Brad Smith said that in 31 years of coaching this was the farthest his team had gone for the winning touchdown so late in the game. The TD reception was one of three passes that Sheets caught last Saturday for a total of 45 yards. For the season, he has 22 receptions for 319 yards. He is also averaging 23.4 yards on 18 kickoff returns. Chadron State is 6-2 on the season and 4-2 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. They will host New Mexico Highlands on Saturday with a noon kickoff.

Wildcats can't afford to look past Baylor

MANHATTAN (AP) — For Kansas State, the mission is simple. Keep on winning, and the Wildcats will play in the Big 12 title game. Lose just once more, and their last attainable preseason goal becomes much harder to reach. And yet, Saturday's game against Baylor (3-5, 1-3 Big 12) would appear to be little more than a speed bump for Kansas State, which needs two wins in its final four games to be eligible for an 11th straight bowl bid. The Bears, winless in four previous games against the Wildcats, rank 112th nationally in total offense at 289.6 yards per game and 102nd in scoring offense at 17.9 points per game. Kansas State, meanwhile, averages 37.9 points per game — 11th in the nation — and has two record-breaking offensive weapons in quarterback Ell Roberson and running back Darren Sproles. But with two conference losses and two of their wins coming against NCAA Division I-AA opponents, the Wildcats (6-3, 2-2) can't afford an upset. "Once you overlook a team, you can definitely get a loss," linebacker Josh Buhl said. "We don't want to overlook anyone. We prepare like we prepare for anyone else." The Bears, under new coach Guy Morriss, were 3-2 after beating Colorado 42-30 in their Big 12 opener. Since then, they've lost three straight. Two of those defeats were blowouts — a 73-10 loss to Texas A&M on Oct. 11 and last week's 56-0 shutout by No. 16 Texas. Still, Morriss said he has seen some positives from the Bears, even in those lopsided losses.

Trojan volleyball sweeps Butler Co.

The Colby Community College Lady Trojan volleyball team swept Butler County Wednesday night three games to zero to end their regular season with a 24-17 overall record. The Lady Trojans won 31-29, 30-11, and 30-13. Ashley Blickenstaff led Colby with 15 kills and 4 solo blocks. Amy Nichols and Jessica Davis added 9 and 8, receptively. Kayla Pelton had 36 set assists. Pelton and Emily Heim led the team with 5 service aces apiece. Defensively, Nichols had 13 digs, while Jenni Sramek added 12. Sramek also was 22 of 23 on serve receives. Colby finishes the regular season 24-17 overall, 3-5 in Jayhawk West play and 1-2 in District play. They will open the playoffs on Sunday.
