Sheets, a former Colby High football standout, caught the gamewinning pass last Saturday afternoon as the Chadron (Neb.) State Eagles squeaked past Western State College, 23-22, at Gunnison, Colo.

The pass was a 15-yarder thrown by quarterback Shawn Eisenreich with just 1:27 left to play. Sheets caught the ball in the corner of the end zone. The Eagles had completed a 54-yard pass to Bryce Flammang of Cambridge (Neb.) two plays earlier to set up the win-

Chadron State coach Brad Smith said that in 31 years of coaching this was the farthest his team had gone for the winning touchdown so late in the game.

The TD reception was one of three passes that Sheets caught last Saturday for a total of 45 yards. For the season, he has 22 receptions for 319 yards. He is also averaging 23.4 yards on 18 kickoff returns.

Chadron State is 6-2 on the season and 4-2 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. They will host New Mexico Highlands on Saturday with a noon kickoff.


