Ell Roberson actually is K-State's quarterback. But in Iowa State's view, he runs as well as any tailback in the Big 12.

'We're going to treat him like a running back," defensive end Jason Berryman said. "We're going to attack him like he's a running back."

Roberson and the actual running back, Darren Sproles, will lead Kansas State (7-3, 3-2 Big 12) in search of its fourth straight victory on Saturday.

The Wildcats have come back strong after losing three straight at midseason and would become the Big 12 North champions if they win

"They seem to be hitting on all cylinders in recent games," said Iowa State coach Dan McCarney, whose team has lost six in a row. "They are really explosive."

Kansas State has outscored its last three opponents 129-36. Roberson has averaged 284 total yards in those three games, passing for seven touchdowns and running for five. He has accounted for 27 of Kansas State's 44 touchdowns this

Sproles has rushed for 243 yards in that stretch and had 308 all-purpose yards in a 38-10 victory over Baylor last week. In that game, Sproles rushed for 155 yards in 19 carries, caught a pass for 7 yards, returned two punts for 20 yards and
