Irojans get 17th straight home win

Trojans held off several Butler County rallies Saturday afternoon and avoided a season sweep by the Grizzlies winning their 17th straight home game 76-69 in the Colby Community Building..

With the win, Colby head coach Brian Ostermann etched his name in the record books, becoming the winningest coach in school history. In his fifth season, Ostermann has guided the Trojans to several milestones including their second best season in school history at 26-7 last year. Ostermann earned his 86th win Saturday on the Trojan sideline and currently owns an 86-62 overall record in four plus seasons as the Trojan head coach.

Colby held the lead the entire first half finishing the opening frame up 33-27. The Trojans built the lead to 9 twice and 10 once in the first half. Butler County rallied in the second half to take two different one-point leads, the last coming with 10:17

The Colby Community College remaining. The Trojans responded and never trailed again.

Two consecutive baskets by Justin Williams and a three-pointer by Ontario McKee opened the Trojans lead to 10 with 3:36 left before Butler County mounted one last comeback attempt.

Ignited by nine points from Chris Lee, Butler County made a 11-4 run to cut the lead to three with 48 seconds left. After a turnover by the Trojans, Lee missed a contested shot. Branden Miller hit four of four free throws down the stretch to seal the Trojan victory.

Colby was led by Justin Williams 24 points and 15 rebounds. Branden Miller added 14 while Ontario McKee scored 13 points. EJ Drayton contributed 11 points and 5 assists in the win. Colby out-rebounded Butler County 32-24 and held the Grizzlies to 42.9 percent shooting. Colby connected on 50.9 percent of their shots, including 60 percent in the second half.

Colby is now 20-3 overall and 6-3 in Jayhawk West Conference action. They will travel to Garden City Wednesday for another conference game. Game time is set for 8 p.m.
