

Trojan wrestlers pound Air Force Academy jayvee, 32-9

Free Press Contributor "Colby is a better tournament team than dual team this season." This comment has been shared by many of the nation's "in-the-know" iunior college wrestling fans since this season's early polls were released. But the shellacking the Troians bestowed upon the Air Force Academy JV team Friday evening in the Colby Community Building may have some rethinking that notion. The Trojan wrestlers certainly gave a sizable home crowd a lot to cheer about during their 32-9 win over the visitors from Colorado Springs.

The first match of the evening was at 133 pounds, due to a double forfeit at he 125 pound weight class.

The 133 pound bout ended regulation deadlocked in a 3-3 tie, but the 1:16 in riding time accumulated throughout the course of the match gave Kyle Patton (freshman, pounds but moved up to 149 pounds Wellsville) a bonus point to secure for Drue Herl, who was noticeably the win. Patton's win gave Colby a 3-0 lead in the team score race.

Air Force JV forfeited to Colby at 141 pounds, as their athlete did not make weight. But an exhibition match was wrestled between Tony Lombardi (freshman, Key West, Fla.) and Luke Vitolo anyway. Lombardi won the exhibition match over Vitolo by an 8-4 score on the strength of an early takedown and nicely executed pinning combination. While the exhibition was for nothing more than experience, the

forfeit gave Colby a 9-0 lead.

Bellville, Ohio) then took the mat at 149 pounds for the Trojans. Wenger normally competes at 141 absent from the Trojans' line-up. Wenger opened his match with Derek Ebeling in fine fashion by scoring an early takedown. But Ebeling appeared to gradually deplete the stamina of the smaller Wenger and pulled away late in the match for a 10-3 victory. This cut the Colby team score lead to 9-3.

Muzaffar Abdurakhmanov (sophomore. Tashkent, Uzbekistan) then put on a takedown demonstration in his bout against Beau Tresemer. Abdurakhmanov recorded several takedowns in his bout prior to scoring a technical fall victory just a few seconds into the third period of his 165 pound match.

Zach Luedke (freshman, Colby) was then able to score a well earned 10-4 victory over Logan Brewer at 174 pounds. And C.B. Dollaway (sophomore, Mt. Gilead, Ohio) dismantled Hugoton product Zane Hershey by technical fall in the 184 pound bout. The four match winning streak stretched Colby's team

score lead to 26-3.

But Air Force JV was able to get back on the scoreboard at 197 pounds when Peter Bozynksi pinned Ryan Zweygardt (sophomore, St. Francis). Zweygardt put forth a gutsy effort against Bozynski, who outweighed the Trojan wrestler by over 30 pounds. Zweygardt normally competes at 165 pounds, but filled in against the Air Force JV for an ailing Ed Jaramillo (freshman, Rocky Ford, Colo.).

Sam Karash (freshman, Grant, Neb.) then earned a forfeit at 285 pounds to secure a 32-9 win for the Trojans.

Next action for the Trojans will be in the West-Central Regional a total of twenty-five nationally national qualifying tournament in ranked wrestlers will be in Parsons.

Parsons this coming Saturday. The West-Central Region has long been known as the most competitive regional in the country, and this year's version is no different. Northwest College (Wyoming) is currently the top ranked team in the country. The #12-ranked Colby Community College Trojan men jumped out to a 8-0 lead and never trailed defeating Cloud County 94-62 Saturday night at the Colby Community Building and in the process building their home court winning streak

to 18. Colby built a 26-13 lead midway through the first half before Cloud County answered with a 15-2 run to tie the game at 28. It was the only tie in the game as Colby responded with a 10-0 run over 2 minutes and

ended the half with a 44-32 lead.




