The Oberlin Red Devils, playing on their home court, stayed right with the Colby Eagles in action last Friday night. That was the first half. There was no staying with the Eagles in the second half as the travelers came home with a 67-39 victory, their 12th of the season against but 4 losses.

The Eagles are ranked #9 in this week's Kansas Basketball Coaches Association poll.

Oberlin led the Eagles by a single point, 10-9 when the buzzer buzzed a halt to action in the first quarter. In the second, however, Colby began to muscle their way around and in the process scored 20 big points to take a 29-24 lead into the break.


