If you are looking for a good book to read on these cold winter evenings, perhaps one of these titles will fit the bill. Nancy Thayer's *The Hot Flash Club* is a witty fast-paced novel about four women who discover the joys of friendship - and a lot of other things in the bargain. Faye the artist, Shirley the healer, Marilyn the brain, and Alice the executive are all feeling over the hill and out of the race.

When they meet, they find they share a lot more than raging hormones and lost dreams. As members of the *Hot Flash Club* they can discuss topics like motherhood, sex and men - and all the while enjoy double servings of chocolate cake. Soon they vow to help each other - and themselves.

For these four women, the time has come to use it or lose it - be it

their bodies, their brains, their spirits, or their sense of fun.

Together they realize that they can have it all. *The Hot Flash Club* is as much fun as a girl's night out.

If you want something a little more serious, John Le Carre has a new one out called *Absolute Friends*.

This is a novel that suggests that a man's good heart might just be his worst enemy.

Ted Mundy is a failed writer, expatriate son of a British Army officer, and used-to-be spy. Now he is a down-at-the-heels tour guide in

southern Germany dodging creditors, supporting a new family, and keeping an eye out for trouble while in spare moments vigorously questioning the actions of the country he once served.

He meets an old friend named Sasha who has been traveling the Middle East and Asia as an itinerant university lecturer.

Sasha introduces him to a mysterious billionaire philanthropist named Dimitri who offers to provide a path that will take them out of poverty and give them a chance to change the world.

But who is Dimitri and why does his gold pour in from mysterious Middle Eastern bank accounts?

Le Carre fans have been waiting for this masterpiece novel which is an epic tale of loyalty and betrayal that spans the lives of two friends

from the Cold War to the present day of terrorism.

Finally, Jerry Jenkins, author of the Left Behind series, has returned with a novel called *Soon*, which is described as "the beginning of the end."

In the aftermath of World War III, the world is resolved to eliminate war once and for all. The war killed millions of people and wiped out entire countries.

Now all nations have agreed to remove the most serious threat to world peace - they have outlawed religion. Paul Stepola, a key player in this fight against religious extremists, is an agent working for the National Peace Organization.

The law has forced religion underground and he is determined to flush the zealots out and destroy them.

However, his quest points him to startling revelations. Supernatural events are happening that he cannot explain.

The religious underground calls them miracles - Paul calls them conspiracies.

But when one event hits close to home, Paul can no longer deny the truth. *Soon* is a supernatural thrill ride into the future.
