There has been a great deal of interest in Mel Gibson's "Passion of the Christ" now showing at movie theatres across the nation. The graphic portrayal of Jesus, trial and crucifixion has many people asking about the claims of Christ and how they can personally experience his love in their lives. It's a life-changing experience to realize that Jesus CHOSE to give his life for us while we were still sinners and estranged from God. God CHOSE to give his Son, His Son Jesus CHOSE to give his life, and Jesus asks us to CHOOSE to accept his gift of restored relationship with God through his paying the price for our sins on the cross.

And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death—even death on a cross!

"Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."
