Then with the bases loaded their pitcher threw a wild pitch that let the winning run score.

Clutch hits are what we have been missing from our attack, and I feel that is where we broke through this past week. We faced some of the best pitching we have seen all season, and responded by hitting better than we have all season.

Friday afternoon we lost to Chandler-Gilbert of Arizona, 6-1. They are currently ranked 20th in the pen, but it takes a lot of strength.
