liquid materials and 50 pounds of solids per household.

2) This is a free service to Thomas County households only, no business wastes can be accepted.

3) Used motor oil should be taken to the county landfill for recycling.

4) Participants are asked not to bring empty containers — those can be discarded as regular household trash.

This service is provided as a safe disposal alternative through the household hazardous waste facility, 190 W. 4th St. in Colby, Swob said.
