Both the Eagles and Monarchs are ranked #1 in their respective regions. Having attained the #1 seed for the regional tourney, Colby will receive a bye in the first round and will play for a berth in the state tourney on May 19 at Ulysses. The times and pairings have not as yet been determined.

After another week of play, the Eagles have pushed their record to 16-2 on the season, picking up six wins — over Lakin, 9-1, 8-4; Holcomb, 10-0, 14-0; and Healy/ Leoti, 10-0, 6-1.

The varsity pitching staff is doing an excellent, and contributing to this effort, said coach Cox, is solid defensive plays. he said the Eagles are now forcing plays which would result in errors, and they are making good plays.


