Coach Lampe signs four area wrestlers

Steve Lampe, head wrestling coach at Colby Community College, recently announced four area high school seniors have signed letters of intent to wrestle for the Trojans.

Bobby Dennis of Oakley is the state champion at 189 pounds. He will wrestle in the 184-pound division for Colby College.

Mathieu Gilliland of Hoxie will compete at 141 pounds.


Also from Hoxie, twin brothers Matt Schippers and Jason Schippers will compete on the 2004-05 squad.

"Matt and Jason will wrestle at

149 pounds and 157 pounds," said Lampe. "I don't know yet who will wrestle at which weight."

The four freshmen will join Colby natives Eric and Zach Luedke. Eric will compete in the 165-pound division with Zach at 174 pounds.

"This is the largest group of western Kansas athletes to compete for the Trojans in the past 20 years," said Lampe. "There is also a possibility of adding at least one more area wrestler. I am very pleased with this group and look forward to working with them next fall."
