

Colby Eagle baseball in regional showdown

The Colby Eagle softball ladies are a step closer to the state playoffs after beating Larned in first round action of the Class 4A Regional in Colby Monday afternoon, 3-2. They are in Pratt today taking on Hugoton in the semifinals.

Hugoton drew a first round bye with a 17-1 record and the #1 seed. Colby is seeded #4 and takes an 11-8 record into today's semifinal game.

Against Larned on Monday, Sarah Redmond went the distance. She allowed two runs, three hits, eight strikeouts and issued two walks.

Offensively, Savannah Rupp and Cierra Rous had Colby's only hits, but they took advantage of eight walks and some defensive miscues to get the victory.

Redmond, said coach Jack Elliott, did a good job coming off illness, and Whitney Adams was solid filling in for Shauna Cox (season ending knee injury) at catcher.

"We will need to pick up the offense to get further this season,' Elliott said.

The other semifinal game at Pratt today is at 4:45 and will pit Ulysses against Pratt. Ulysses is 13-6 and Pratt is 11-8.

The two semifinal winners this afternoon meet early this evening for the championship and a ticket to the state playoffs.

In other first round regional games on Monday, Ulysses, the #2 seed blanked Scott City (#7), 10-0 and Pratt, #3, upended Goodland, #8, 15-1.

Scott City closed out its season 3-14 and Goodland ended the year at 4-15.
