Bargaining continues between SBC and union

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — SBC Communications Inc. and a union representing 100,000 striking workers both said Sunday that intensified bargaining had yielded some progress toward a new contract but that sizable hurdles still had to be cleared.

Sunday was the third day in a four-day strike by the Communications Workers of America over health care and job security issues. The walkout is scheduled to end Tuesday. Negotiations were conducted through the day by regional tables in Chicago; New Haven, Conn; Austin, Texas; and Pleasanton, Calif. The regional tables correspond to the former standalone local-phone companies

that now comprise San Antoniobased SBC, which is the primary local-phone provider in 13 states: Texas, Arkansas, California, Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Missouri, Nevada, Ohio, Oklahoma and Wisconsin.

SBC spokesman Walt Sharp said he would not discuss developments on specific aspects of the
