Chautauqua to offer many activities for children

Many opportunities for children and families are available during *Bleeding Kansas Chautauqua* which will be in Colby, Friday through Tuesday, June 11-15.

Workshops, a Kid-Tauqua Tent, museum programs and a special Youth Chautauqua Camp will help bring the stories of history to life, said Judy Kleinsorge, local coordinator for the event.

In each host community, the Chautauquans will lead workshops about their character and the time period. These workshops are intended for school-aged children. All are free and open to the public. No preregistration is required.

They are: Friday, June 11, 1 p.m., at the Pioneer Memorial Library:

Folktales of African People in America with Charles Pace. Saturday, June 12, at 11 a.m., on the deck of the Senior Progress Center, Fike Park: *Important Places and Faces* with Dave Dickerson. That afternoon at 1 p.m. at the Prairie Museum of Art and History: *Tall Tales of Territorial Times* with Fred Krebs.

Krebs will present another children's workshop on Sunday, June 13, 1 p.m., at the Museum: *Growing Up in the Territory*. Then on Monday at 1 p.m. at the Museum: *All Aboard the Underground Railroad* with Diane Eickhoff.

The last workshop will be held on Tuesday, June 15 at 1 p.m. at the library: *Dear Mr. President with Ri-*

chard Johnson.

Each evening before the main program, a special tent for families with hands-on activities about the Bleeding Kansas period will also be available, Kleinsorge said.

The Kid-Tauqua Tent features games and toys from the period, coloring pages, try-on clothes, and other activities. It is free and open to the public.

The Prairie Museum of Art and History is also offering some special programs for children in grades 1-4. There will be a storytelling session on Monday, June 14 from 9 to 10 a.m. entitled Santa Fe Trail Stories and a children's activity program about the Underground Railroad entitled *Following the Drink-*

ing Gourd on Tuesday, June 15 from 9 to 11 a.m.

These programs are free, she said, but preregistration is required as enrollment is limited.

Deadline for registration is Tuesday, June 8.

In addition, the Kansas Humanities Council has partnered with *Ride Into History* to offer a five-day camp where participants will learn how to research, write, and perform a historical character.

Each participant will have the opportunity to perform under the main Chautauqua tent on Tuesday.

Ride Into History co-directors, Dr. Joyce Thierer, a history faculty member at Emporia State University, and Dr. Ann Birney, an Ameri-

can Studies scholar, will lead the camp.

Thierer and Birney are often recognized as Calamity Jane and Amelia Earhart and were recently in area schools for Women's History Month portraying "Jo," a Civil War veteran, and Julia Archibald Holmes.

The Youth Chautauqua Camp is intended for students in 5th-8th grades who must attend all five sessions. It is free, but registration is required due to limited enrollment. Deadline for registration is Friday.
